Home-Based Care

The Home-Based Care team visits the sick and dying in their homes in Alexandra on a weekly basis, including HIV/ AIDS patients. They provide advice, comfort, spiritual support, food, clothing, bed linen and household equipment. They also repair and clean the shacks that the patients live in. The team continues to visit patients until they are stable.

The Early Childhood Development (ECD) project aims to equip caregivers in crèches with the skills and knowledge to nurture 0 – 6 year olds to develop and thrive. The focus is on health and the early educational needs of the children.
